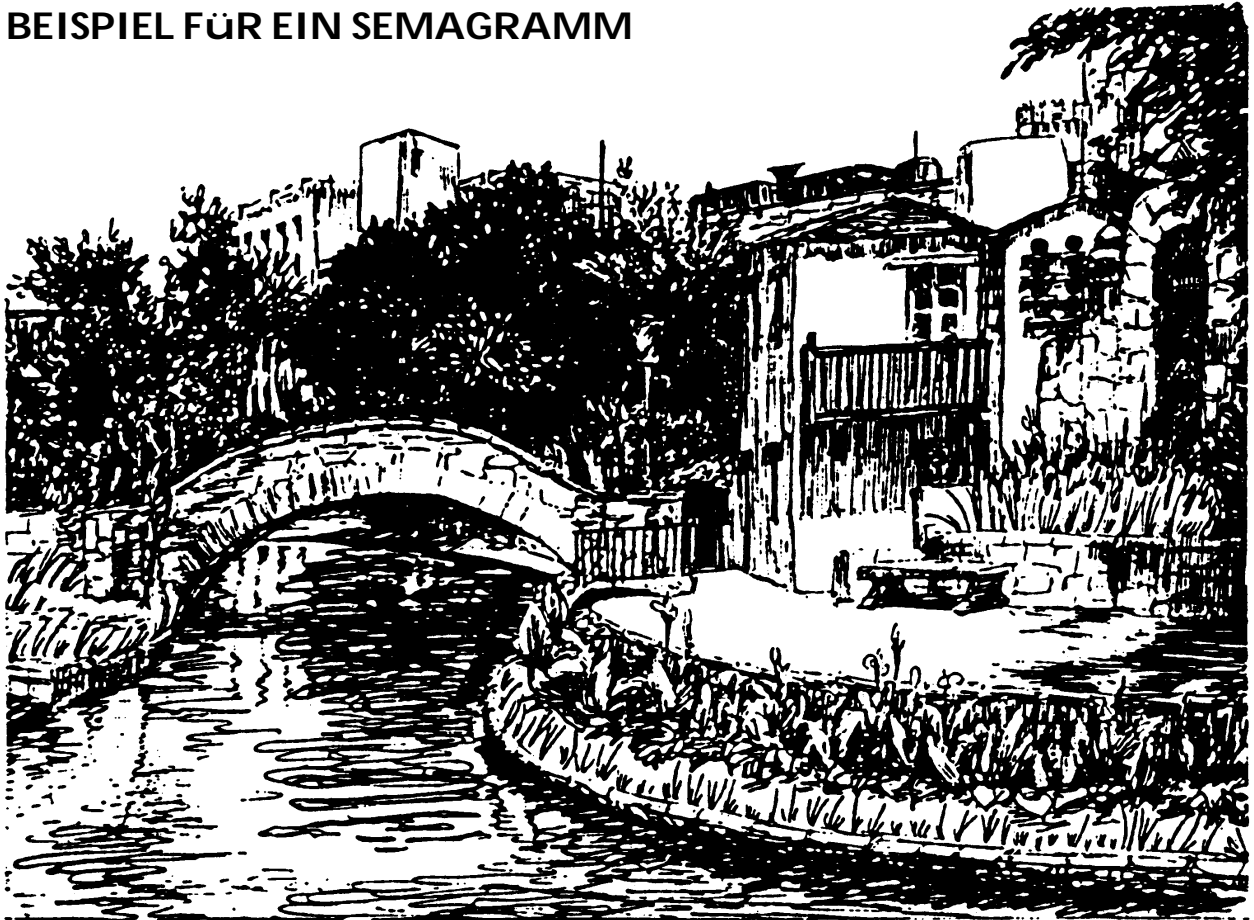


BEISPIEL FÜR EIN SEMAGRAMM

BEISPIEL FÜR EINE UNSICHTBAR GETARNTGE GEHEIMSCHRIFT
